
ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN.... THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED!!

There is no better community to relate to than the kind of church that respects every human being and welcomes them to the table of Holy Communion and fellowship. Is that not us?

It is truly us! We are a welcoming people characterized by being a vibrant faith community that demonstrates Christ's hospitality and love in the world through the service of caring for others.

A mission statement created by our parish from 1990's put it this way:

"The Episcopal Church of the Resurrection is a Christian Community offering an open-minded approach to issues of faith and morality, rooted in a catholic expression of worship and Christian formation."

As our vision:

"We invite people to share in our traditional worship, spiritual development, strong sense of community, quality Christian education, and social outreach ministries"

Have these written values changed? ...I don't think they have.

This coming Sunday between the services we will hear more about how we can be "evangelism" people, being prepared to tell our story, and being like the disciples, ready and prepared to spread the message of Christ.
